<p>Amisfield Dry Riesling 2006</p> <p><i>'Grown Not Made'</i> is the philosophy that Amisfield live by. Based in Central Otago, three quarters of the way down New Zealand's South Island, Amisfield and the other producers in the world's southernmost wine region are surrounded by snow-capped mountains for much of the year. With one of New Zealand's top winemakers in Jeff Sinnott and a world-class winery and restaurant, Amisfield are a serious operation. Their pinot noir has been Wine Spectator's top Central Otago wine for the last two vintages. This riesling is floral with honeysuckle notes and a firm citrus acidity, well balanced and will cellar nicely.</p>	US\$21	\$27		
<p>Astrolabe Sauvignon Blanc 2007</p> <p>Simon Waghorn's career in wine spans over 20 years. He has something of a magic touch in NZ, with almost everything he does winning awards and receiving praise. Astrolabe is his personal project, started by him and a few friends in 1996. They strive to make wines that express the grapes and the individual vineyard sites in Marlborough, at the northern tip of the South Island. With both mountains (something of a theme in NZ) and rivers as a backdrop to the vineyards, it makes for a spectacular view. The 2007 sauvignon blanc is a wonderful expression of both grape and region. Red current leaf, lemongrass and lime on the nose with strong gooseberry fruit on the palate. <p>Cloudy Bay Sauvignon Blanc 2007</p> <p>Cloudy Bay has set, for so many years, the standard for all of Marlborough to aim for. Established in 1985 by the owners of Australian winery Cape Mentelle, it went from strength to strength and is now recognised as one of the top producers in the southern hemisphere, if not the world. The picture on their label captures the essence of this, the centre of NZ's wine industry. The newly released '07 sauvignon blanc is a small step toward a more elegant style, with a delicate passion fruit and slate nose, subtle fruit and gentle acidity. Once again this confirms its status as a benchmark for sauvignon blanc in New Zealand.</p>	US\$27	\$34		
<p>van Asch Pinot Gris 2007</p> <p>van Asch, the brainchild of Henry van Asch, are makers of some of the most interesting and stylish wines in Central Otago. Henry van Asch made his name as one of the founders of AJ Hackett Bungy, and was responsible for bringing bungy jumping to the wider world. Lucky for us, he diversified in to the wine industry and, next to the first bungy bridge in NZ, set up a winery. The '07 pinot gris is their finest offering yet. Apple blossom and cinnamon aromas, ginger and pear on the palate, weight and texture to die for and a decadent sweetness. What more could you want?</p>	US\$25	\$30		

<p align="center">Foxes Island Pinot Noir 2005</p> <p>Foxes Island is named for the ridge upon which the vineyards sit, once the only dry spot amongst flood-ravaged valleys. This pinot noir, with fruit sourced from both the Awatere Valley and their home block in Rapaura, shows some of the best that Marlborough pinot has to offer. Winemaker John Belsham is one of the leading winemakers and judges in the country, making wines that the industry wants to drink and commanding the respect of his peers. The '05 is wonderfully aromatic with violets and clove spice, the palate is silky with great depth.</p>	US\$37	\$47		
<p align="center">Northburn Pinot Noir 2006</p> <p>Northburn, a Merino sheep station in the Cromwell Basin, deep in the heart of the South Island, turned their hands to wine in 1999. And what wine it is! Their pinot noir sits happily and quietly at the top of the pile in Central Otago. 2006 was something of a dream vintage here, and it shows. This is what Otago pinot is all about. A savoury yet elegant offering with soft cherry fruit and a gamy character. Incredible complexity and great depth make this a safe bet every year, if you can find it!</p>	US\$35	\$44		
<p align="center">Mount Edward Pinot Noir 2006</p> <p>Named for the mountain in Gibbston, Central Otago, Mount Edward is the personal project of three of the region's pioneers and innovators. For those of you familiar with Wine Spectator, Matt Kramer said of this pinot noir, "<i>Damn good... Compelling Pinot Noir is a matter of layered dimensionality, where you don't discover everything about a wine in one sip. Happily wineries such as Mount Edward deliver such multi-dimensional goods.</i>" The 2006 pinot is delicately scented of cherries and cinnamon with great depth and a long life ahead of it.
